

SkyWarn Recognition Day was held at the NWS La Crosse, WI, office on Saturday, December 7th from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Hams from Minnesota and Wisconsin made contacts with other NWS stations across the US along with hams operating from their QTHs. This is an annual event recognizing the contribution that SkyWarn/ARES hams make in ensuring the safety of their communities by staffing Emergency Operations Centers (EOC) and deploying to monitor severe weather.

RARC hams that attended the event were Steve Wiebke (WOSTV) Olmsted County ARES EC, George Hopkins (NOUM) RARC Treasurer and Melissa Erickson (KEOWNH) John Marshall High School (Rochester, MN) Radio Club Mentor.







Amateur Radio Emergency Service

The Olmsted SkyWarn group made a good representation at the La Crosse National Weather Service headquarters for their SkyWarn spotter appreciation day on December 7th from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. There were a lot of people from other county spotter groups there. The N.W.S. staff gave tours of the building and explained the new and future tools that they use to get more accurate and faster technical information on weather in the tri-state area. The food was good and plentiful, and comradery was great. You could operate any of the three HF radio stations that was set up by their local ham radio club to make contacts with other NWS centers and storm spotters in the USA. Propagation was not the best, and there were other HF contests operating at the same time. The Olmsted SkyWarn group added 2 states to the La Crosse NWS national radio contact map. If you have not attended one of these annual events, you need to plan to be there in 2025.

We were informed that Todd Shea will be retiring from the NWS this coming May. He has been an icon for many years for all the tristate spotter groups. For decades he has been teaching the annual storm spotter training programs in three states. He has been the one that gives and receives weather spotter information to net controllers to keep their field spotters safe and informed. He will be missed.

Olmsted and Fillmore SkyWarn took the time to have a fun day getting together for both our storm spotter teams. On December 21st a party was held at the Spring Valley Ambulance building with food. drinks, videos, and many gifts. There were so many gifts that everyone took home at least 2. The best reason was to meet each other's storm spotter counterparts and have a fun time, and that we did. The party/meeting took place from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM. (went to 1:30). Next year we will host this event.

The Olmsted ARES group has started taking online training through the ARRL ARES basic training course. This program is available to anyone for free. ARES is a major part of both the Olmsted and Rochester EOC's operations staff and have responsibilities to deliver fast, accurate, and documented information. January starts the 2025 contest season. There are both VHF and HF events to look forward to this month. Here are a few of the more popular one's:

- January 4-5 <u>ARRL RTTY Roundup</u>: This contest typically takes place during the first weekend of January and involves making as many contacts as possible using RTTY (Radio Teletype) and other digital modes.
- January 13 (CW) and January 21 (SSB) North American QSO Party (NAQP): This series includes both CW (Morse code) and SSB (voice) contests. The NAQP contests are known for their friendly atmosphere and are great for operators of all skill levels.
- January 18-20 <u>VHF Contest</u>: This is a weekend long event for amateurs to work as many stations in different grid squares as possible on frequencies above 50 MHz.
- January 26 <u>CQ 160-Meter Contest</u>: This contest focuses on the 160-meter band and is a favorite among those who enjoy low-band operation. The SSB version is in February.
- **January 25-26** <u>Winter Field Day</u>: Held on the last full weekend of January. This event encourages emergency communication preparedness while having fun in a contest-like environment.
